



## Where To Take It

The City of Shoreline offers Clean Sweep Recycling Events twice a year for residents. If you have items that are not accepted at the events or if you want to recycle items throughout the year, refer to the list below. ### **Appliances** *Fees apply*

- ❖ Appliances can be recycled for a fee at the Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station. For pick-up service, JACO Environmental will accept a variety of appliances including refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers and water heaters. Call 1-800-414-5072 for information.

### **Batteries (Household)** Free service

- ❖ Alkaline, nickel-cadmium, lithium-ion, and other household batteries can be taken to collection bins at the Richmond Beach library and Shoreline library. See Hazardous Materials below for lead-acid batteries.

### **Business Hazardous Waste Hotline** Free service

- ❖ For prompt, free and confidential information about hazardous chemicals or waste, call (206) 263-8899.

### **Cell Phones** Free service

- ❖ Local recycling is available at Verizon Wireless in Aurora Village at 1255 N. 205<sup>th</sup> St., Ste. 101. The Verizon store can be reached at (206) 542-4132. Cell phones and PDAs may also be taken to the Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station.

### **Computers** *Free service*

To recycle working or non-working computers, monitors and laptops, take up to 5 items per donor per day to the Shoreline Goodwill store at 14500 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE, (206) 631-8454 or Deseret Industries at 17935 Aurora Ave N, (206) 542-9447.

### **Computer Components** *Fees may apply*

### **Hazardous Materials** Free service for residents

- ❖ The Aurora Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site is open Sunday, Monday and Tuesday from 9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. It is located at 12550 Stone Avenue North, Seattle 98133. Please call (206) 296-4692 to ask about quantity restrictions and to hear dates when the Household Hazardous Wastemobile will come to Shoreline. Both the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site and the Wastemobile accept **aerosols, adhesives, antifreeze, automotive products, fluorescent light bulbs, glues, hobby chemicals, pesticides, oil or lead-based paint, solvents, thinners, and toxic cleaning products**. ## **Metal** Free service

- ❖ Northwest Metals & Salvage Services located at 9607 Aurora Ave N. will buy back scrap copper, aluminum, brass, stainless steel, and insulated wire. Steel, iron, and galvanized piping are accepted for free. For information call (206) 525-0814.

## **Motor Oil** *Fees may apply*

- ❖ Used, uncontaminated motor oil can be recycled at these locations: Schuck's at 18025 Aurora Ave. N., (206) 533-0179; and Schuck's at 20319 Ballinger Way NE, (206) 361-1025. Please call before you go.

## **Packing Material** *Fees may apply*

- ❖ Many privately-owned mail and packaging houses will accept foam peanuts and bubble wrap for reuse.

## **Paint (Latex)** Free service

- ❖ Air dry or solidify latex paint using pet litter, and then place the open container in your garbage. For **oil and lead-based paint**, take it to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site mentioned previously in the Hazardous Materials section on p.1.

## **Plastic Bags** Free service

- ❖ Many grocery stores have a bin at the front of the store to collect and recycle clean, empty plastic bags.

## **Plastic Plant Pots** Free service

- ❖ Take your clean and unbroken plant pots to Shoreline Goodwill at 14500 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE or Deseret Industries at 17935 Aurora Ave N.

## **Shredding - Paper** *Fees apply*

- ❖ Confidential documents can be shredded by Fircrest Contract Services at 15230 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE. Materials are securely shredded and recycled. Please call for rates at (206) 361-3079.

## **Televisions** *Free service*

- ❖ To recycle working or non-working TVs, take up to 5 items per donor per day to the Shoreline Goodwill store at 14500 15<sup>th</sup> Ave NE, (206) 631-8454 or Deseret Industries at 17935 Aurora Ave N, (206) 542-9447. ## **Tires** *Fees apply*

- ❖ Two local sites are available: 1) Les Schwab Tire Center in Shoreline's North City neighborhood will recycle tires if residents call (206) 364-5674 first to confirm that space is available; 2) Discount Tires at 19905 Aurora Ave. N. will accept tires and can be reached at (206) 542-3504.

## **Yard Waste** *Fees apply*

- ❖ Yard waste can be recycled for a fee at the Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station. Mixed loads of vegetation and soil are also accepted at the following businesses (please call for acceptable item details and prices):
