The City of Shoreline offers Clean Sweep Recycling Events twice a year for residents. If you have items that are not accepted at the events or if you want to recycle items throughout the year, refer to the list below.

Appliances	Fees apply	Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station: For drop-off only JACO Environmental: For pick-up only. (800) 414-5072
Batteries (Household)	Free	Richmond Beach and Shoreline Library: Alkaline, nickel-cadmium, lithium-ion, and other household batteries. For lead-acid see <i>Hazardous Materials</i> below.
Business Hazardous Waste Hotline	Free	Call (206) 263-8899 for confidential information about hazardous waste and chemicals.
Cell Phones	Free	Verizon Wireless: 1255 N. 205 th St., Ste. 101. (206) 542-4132 Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station: Free to residents and businesses. Also accepts PDAs, pagers and 2-way radios.
Computers	Free	Deseret Industries: 17935 Aurora Ave N. (206) 542-9447, or Shoreline Goodwill: 14500 15 th Ave NE. (206) 631-8454 To recycle working or non-working computers, monitors and laptops, take up to 5 items per donor per day.
Computer Components	Fees apply	For recycling components, such as fax machines and printers, visit http://your.kingcounty.gov/solidwaste/takeitback/electronics/index.asp .
Hazardous Materials	Free for residents and businesses	Aurora Household Hazardous Waste Collection Site: Open Sunday, Monday and Tuesday from 9:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Items accepted include aerosols, adhesives, antifreeze, automotive products, lead-acid batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, glues, hobby chemicals, pesticides, oil or lead-based paint, solvents, thinners, and toxic cleaning products.

Metal	Free	Shoreline Recycling & Transfer Station: Scrap metal accepted Northwest Metals & Salvage Services: 9607 Aurora Ave N. (206) 525-0814
Motor Oil	Fees may apply	Used, uncontaminated motor oil can be recycled at these locations: Schuck's: 18025 Aurora Ave. N., (206) 533-0179; and Schuck's: 20319 Ballinger Way NE, (206) 361-1025. Please call before you go.
Packing Material	Fees may apply	Many privately-owned mail and packaging houses will accept foam peanuts for reuse.
Paint (Latex)	Free	Air dry or solidify latex paint using pet litter, and then place the open container in your garbage. For oil and lead-based paint , see <i>Hazardous Materials</i> section above.
Plastic Bags (Grocery)	Free	Many grocery stores have a bin at the front of the store to collect and recycle clean, empty plastic grocery bags.
Plastic Plant Pots	Free	Take your clean and unbroken plant pots to Shoreline Goodwill: 14500 15 th Ave NE Deseret Industries: 17935 Aurora Ave N
Propane Tanks	Free	Propane tanks are no longer allowed in the garbage. See <i>Hazardous Materials</i> above.
Shredding—Confidential Paper	Fees may apply	Fircrest Contract Services: 15230 15 th Ave NE. (206) 361-3079. Shredathon Events: http://www.atg.wa.gov/Shredathon.aspx
Televisions	Free	Deseret Industries: 17935 Aurora Ave N. (206) 542-9447, or Shoreline Goodwill: 14500 15 th Ave NE. (206) 631-8454 To recycle working or non-working televisions take up to 5 items per donor per day.
